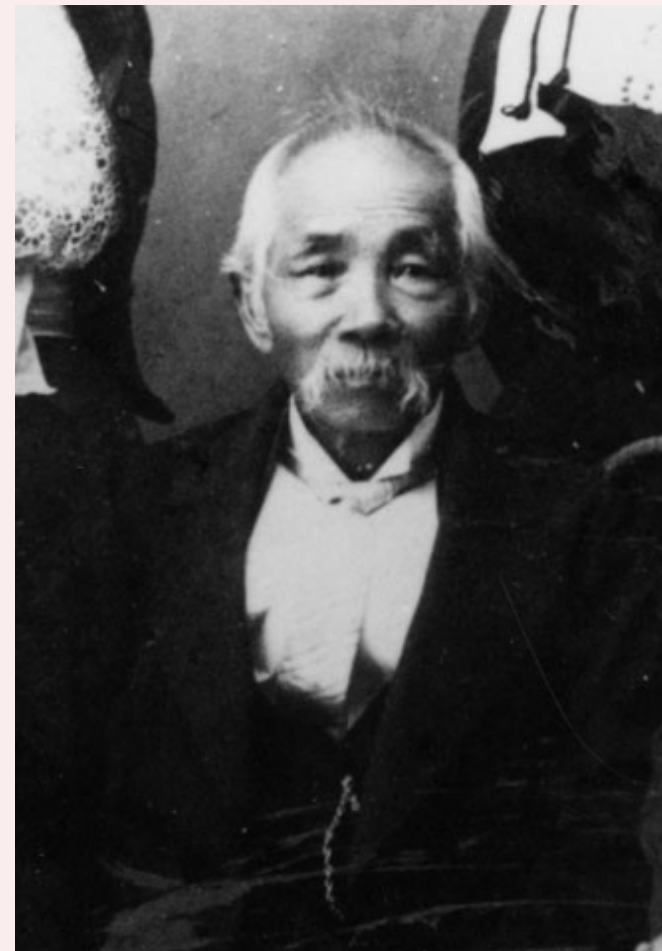

THOSE WERE THE DAYS PEOPLE HISTORY

Chew Chong: (1830-1920) born in China, he worked in English households in Singapore. Spending eleven years as a gold miner and a store keeper in Victoria Australia. Two years on the Otago gold fields then became a peplar, merchant and exporter in Taranaki. In 1868 he began collecting an edible white fungus he found in NZ forests. This was something as a delicacy. Exporting this white fungus better known as “Taranaki wool” overseas and earned NZ about 300,000 pounds over thirty years. He was very far sighted entrepreneur opening store branches in New Plymouth and Eltham and also Inglewood. Milked cows and opened a dairy factory in Eltham. He imported the first cream separator into NZ.
