THOSE WERE THE DAYS PEOPLE HISTORY

Judge Mick Brown. One of the first of a growing number of Maori lawyers. In 2012 Mick celebrated 50 years at the law school and recalled that on his arrival in 1962 Mick Brown was the “only identifiable” Maori law student. By 1979, Mick was mentor of the newly formed “brown bar” which evolved to become the Maori Law Society in 1988. Brown served as a member of the University of Auckland Council for 15 years and was Uni’s Chancellor from 1986 to 1991. He was also Vice Chancellor (maori) at the university until 2005. Judge Mick Brown lifetime of service to NZ was recognised on 5th July 2013 when he was awarded the Blake medal at the Sir Peter Blake leadership awards.
