

The Indus Valley Civilization (3300-1700 BC)

As with Mesopotamia and Egypt, the Indus valley civilization of north western India and Pakistan arose along side a river that flooded regularly, providing rich fertile soil for farming. In fact the flood plain of the River Indus bore close similarities to those of the Tigris and Euprates, with its aridity and the unpredictability of its floods, and as with Mesopotamia, these conditions necessitated cooperation between settlements in order to build large scale irrigation and flood defence projects, spurring the development of city states.
