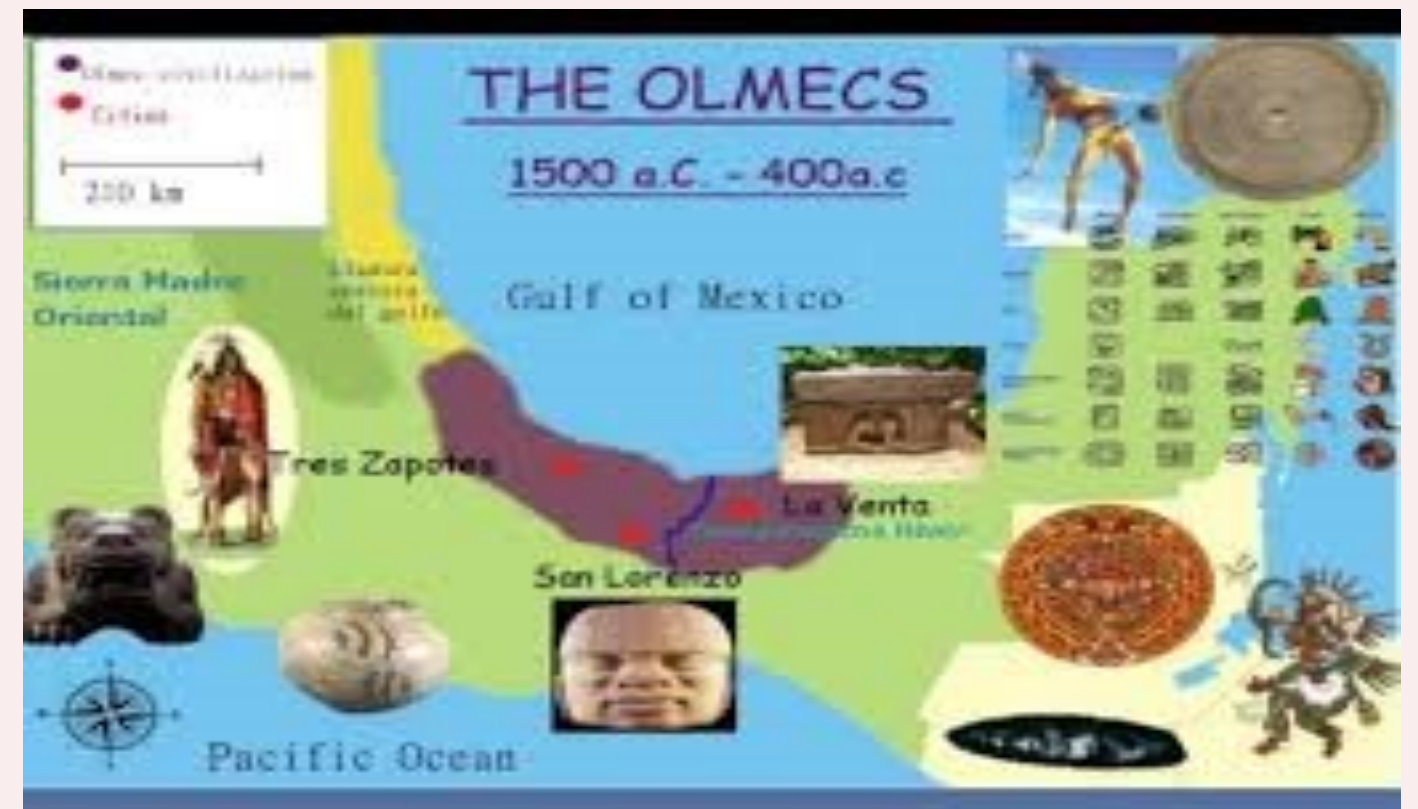

Moments of World History

(Pre history to modern day)

People of the Americas (4000-200 BC)

The prehistoric migrants who crossed the Bering Strait into America some 15,000 to 20,000 years pursued a largely unchanging nomadic existence across the vast North American plains for may 1,000's of years. It was only in the narrower spaces of south eastern Mexico and central America with their fertile flood plains and tropical forests that competition among settlers stimulated cultural activity and the first civilisations were formed. Maize was domesticated in central America by around 2,700, leading to the first sedentary farming communities by around 2300. The soil was sufficiently fertile to produce four crops of maize in a year, enough to support the first complex society in Mesoamerica, the Olmec's.
